Students may want to bring their class schedule and walk from room to room at this time; especially our incoming sixth graders. Teachers will be working in their rooms doing final preparations, and while it is not a time to review academic curriculum, you will be able to put a face with a room number and location!

It's Back to School Time! We are looking forward to reconnecting with our families & students and have planned another educational and activity packed year. Please check the MCMS website often for upcoming field trips, events, and special days.

#### Student arrival/Students being dropped-off by cars:

Student doors will open at 7:00 A.M. All students coming into the building will be directed to go **immediately** to the cafeteria. Prospect Street drop off procedures apply: The driveway/parking is one way going north.

**Please pull up as far as you can** to allow others behind you room to drop off their student/s, and please have your child exit the car once you are stopped so the flow can keep going. Classes begin at 7:35 A.M. Anyone coming into the building after that will be issued a tardy slip.

#### End of day/Student pick-up by car:

Student dismissal is at 2:29 P.M. Car riders and walkers will be held in the cafeteria until the busses have departed. Car riders will be released next. Prospect Street pick up procedures apply: The driveway/parking is one way going north. Overflow parking will be in the Grant circle. **NO** cars are allowed to stop on Prospect Street. **Please pull up as far as you can** to allow others behind you room to pick up their student/s so the flow can keep going with cars leaving. Walkers will be released once the cars have cleared the driveway. Students who are walking will be released from the North end of the building, closest to the crossing guards at Prospect and Washington Streets.

#### P.B.I.S.

The First Day of School is on Wednesday, August 15<sup>th</sup>! During study halls the first full week of school, students will be taught about the Positive Behavior Incentives System (PBIS). Students will learn school-wide expectations in many areas including classrooms, hallways, lunchrooms, busses, bathrooms, and the library. This is a school wide, year-long program with an assembly on Friday, August 24<sup>th</sup> during study hall.

#### Student Packets Mailed Home

If you have moved over the summer you will be required to provide two proofs of residency (driver's license, tax bill or utility bill, etc.). We will not accept a cell phone bill. Please send this into your child's school and add the name of your child(ren) to the documents you send in. Please be advised that these will NOT be returned to you.

Payment of some type is expected if you do not apply for the lunch program. Lunch applications will be available with the child's information or a letter letting you know that you have pre-qualified.

### Free/Reduced Application

These must be turned in as soon as possible to avoid any charges to your families account. Please note that if you do not reapply with the lunch **application in your packet**, you will be responsible for all fees also, which must be paid in full by April 1, 2019.



### Moving Out of District

If your student is not returning to District #165 for the **2018-2019** school year. Please stop in Marengo Middle School, Grant Intermediate School or Locust School office to fill-out the withdrawal form as soon as possible. These forms (NOTICE OF STUDENT WITHDRAWAL 2018) may also be found online and then mailed/faxed to the school your child(ren) would be attending for the **2018-2019** school year. Please refer to our website ([www.marengo165.org](http://www.marengo165.org)) for fax numbers/addresses for each school.

### Transportation Reminder for Parents

Parents/Guardians please note that if your child is being provided transportation by the district the PICK-UP time and the DROP-OFF time that you receive are within a **ten (10) minute window**. What this means is that a time of 7:00 a.m. for PICK-UP can be anywhere between 6:55 a.m. and 7:05 a.m. and will be considered to be on time. Please make certain your student is at their stop five (5) minutes before their scheduled pick-up time.

**Kindergarten and Pre-K parents/guardians**, if your child does not ride the bus, please do not bring them early, as their teachers are preparing for the day. For the safety of your child, transportation WILL NOT drop your Kindergartener or Pre-K student off if a parent is not present at DROP OFF locations. If this happens, the child will be returned to Locust School at the end of the bus driver's route to wait for parent pick-up.



Parents/Guardian: You must give transportation names/phone numbers of any designated adult(s) other than yourself that can receive your child at the drop off point. We will NOT release your child to anyone that you have not designated us to do so. Anyone you have listed as emergency contacts would be approved to receive your child at their drop off point.

**1<sup>st</sup> - 8<sup>th</sup> graders** will be picked up and dropped off at their assigned stop. Parents DO NOT need to be present. These students will not be returned to the school.

If you have any questions about your students' transportation or a problem your student may have on the bus – please call, **Michele Frank, Transportation Director at (815) 596-1667 or Dena Montgomery, Transportation Department at (815) 568-0778**. We will always return your call, so please leave a message and we will get back to you. Thank you for helping us make the school year pleasant for your child.


### Safety Concern

Please remind your children if they are walking home after school, not to cross Route 20 in front of the school. Students should cross Prospect Street with the crossing guard (by Washington Street), walk up to Route 20 and cross at Locust Street where there is another crossing guard.

### Physicals/Medication Orders/Doctor

#### Notes

Sixth graders have you turned in your physicals, *booster and dental exams?*



All 6<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> grades need to show proof of having a Tdap booster on file at school. Sixth graders will need to show proof of having a second varicella shot, T-Dap to prevent pertussis and the meningitis shot. The meningitis shot was added for 2015-2016 and the first one is due in 6<sup>th</sup> grade and then again in 12<sup>th</sup> grade.

Please check with your physician and turn in the required information.

We would like all the exam forms for the 2018–2019 school year turned in by the first day of school, Wednesday, August 15<sup>th</sup>. If your child will need medication orders (including over the counter medications like Tylenol), please obtain these orders from your doctor.

Attendance will be handled as per state code and Board Policy. If a student misses four (4) or more consecutive days, a note from the doctor is required for the days to be considered excused. If a doctor's visit cannot be made, you may bring your child to the school nurse for an evaluation, or other verification. (Please refer to page 20 in the Parent / Student Handbook for other attendance questions.) Good practice would be anytime your student goes to the doctor, dentist, or eye doctor get a note from them and turn it into the school office. The doctor note will be logged in the computer with their attendance. Thank you!



### MCMS Tardy Policy

We want to make sure that all parents are aware of our tardy policy here at MCMS. This is in reference to either tardies to school, or to individual classes. This is calculated anew for each quarter. It is as follows:

\*5 tardies = lunch detention

\*10 tardies = afterschool detention until 3:30 p.m.

\*15 tardies = alternative school day spent in the office

\*20 or more tardies = a decision based on review by administration

At any time, a student may be placed on a tardy contract to help minimize their tardies.

Another way we minimize tardies is through a **TARDY SWEEP**. During a “Sweep Week”, the consequences for being tardy will be different. We will announce when a sweep will be taking place, so the students will be aware.

During a sweep, each classroom teacher will close their door immediately after the tardy bell has rung. Any students still in the hallway will be given a ticket. This ticket will serve as their pass to class, as well as their assigned detention time (normally the following day). It will be the student's responsibility to inform their parents of this detention. These detentions will go until 3:30 P.M. ### Band Sign Up for Advanced Band

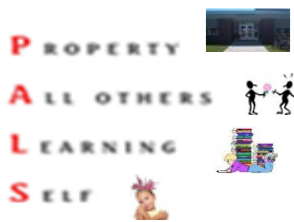

### Attendance and Tardy Policy

Just a friendly reminder about attendance and tardy policy:

- 5 tardies to class = lunch detention, note sent home with student
- 10 tardies to class = after school detention
- 15 tardies to class = alternative day in the office
- 20 tardies to class = Administration involved

Parents please remember that students are only allowed to have nine full or partial days unexcused or tardy to school out of 180 academic school days, before the Regional Office of Education is required to be notified. This includes when the student is on vacation as the absence is considered unexcused.
